Thank you for your interest in the massage training program. This will be the first step to a change in your life. There are some things to be aware of when looking for a Texas 500 Hour Massage Training School.

- 1) All Texas 500 Hour Schools must teach the same number of hours on the same topics, as follows:

The course requirements are as follows:

Swedish Massage Techniques	125 hrs.
Other Massage Techniques	75 hrs.
Human Anatomy	50 hrs.
Human Physiology	25 hrs
Kinesiology	50 hrs
Pathology	40 hrs
Hydrotherapy	20 hrs.
Business Practices, Ethics, Laws	45 hrs.
Human Health, Hygiene. First Aid	20 hrs.
Internship Program	50 hrs.
Total Hours	500 hrs

- 2) Any school licensed to teach the Texas Department of State Health Services approved course cannot alter the above listed course work
- 3) National or International accreditations do not affect the Texas Department of State Health Services school program

Therefore, all schools are teaching the same subjects for the same amount of time. The question is how do they go about teaching to the students? This is what makes a difference between schools.

Before choosing a school (and you should check out all the schools in your area) you should ask several questions, meet with the Director of the school and tour the facility.
